Thank you so much for all the quilt entries, this promises to be a fantastic showing of our fabulous work from the past two years.

#### Reminders:


- 1. Return your ticket stubs and money from the raffle quilt sales during the October meeting.
- 2. Challenge Quilts Sew That Tune registered with Beatrice via email.
- 3. Please be prepared to sign up on the volunteer chart for a job that will help make the show run smoothly. We had a decent sign up during the September meeting but there are still several open spots and ALL MUST be filled in. Free entry into the show if you sign up for a volunteer spot otherwise \$
- 4. We are in need of many tables, small (card tables or plastic) and large 6 to 8 footers for the show days. We are also looking for quilt racks if you can loan one. Please be sure they are labeled with your name. They need to be delivered Friday 19 Oct morning to the church and picked up Sat 20 Oct late afternoon. There will be a sign-up sheet for these at the October meeting if you can help out.
- 5. Label your bags/totes with your name on the bottom with masking tape. Sign them up on the clipboard at the October meeting.
- 6. Label your Anniversary projects with your name on the bottom with masking tape. Sign them up on the clipboard at the October meeting.
- 7. Label your quilts with your name either on a quilt label or with making tape.
- 8. Attach a 4" sleeve to the top back of your quilt leaving approx. 1" of ease, either sewn on or safety pinned top and bottom edges (absolutely NO straight pins please).
- 9. Bring all items to the church Friday 19 Oct between 10 am and 12 noon. If you cannot deliver them at this time make arrangements for a friend to do so. You must have your filled in registration form at this time. (This form was emailed to you.) You will need this form with you to pick up your quilts on Sat afternoon at take down.


LIBRARY REPORT

This month we have two new books for those of you who are interested in doing some crazy quilting.

Lots of information on hand stitching.



Valerie Bothell encourages readers to stitch daily, even for a few minutes. If you can stitch one seam 5 days a week, over the course of a year readers will complete 250 seams! The book includes instructions for 61 basic embroidery stitches and over 500 seamtreatment stitch combinations, as well as crazy-quilt-block piecing instructions and information about tools and supplies.



Dive into Laura's delightful world of embroidery and learn how to create small, free-form embroidery pieces that are alive with color and texture. With instructions for 21 embroidery stitches and 6 projects, all in Laura's signature colorful, whimsical style, you'll transform a flat, plain surface into a joyful, design-packed art piece. Stitch on wool, felt, or silk, and enjoy the simple pleasure of slow stitching. Includes a gallery of display ideas
