of my niece's brought me a gift of fabric scraps from a tailor from her trip to Nepal. She said that they were actually made in India. I decided to try to use them all up. I only have one quilt left to complete which will

use the largest fan


shapepieces.



The five quilts that I have completed so far were a lot of fun to make. I decided to separate the scraps by colour. The next decision was to only add "grunge" fabrics for


backgrounds so that the
Nepal fabrics would
become the focus of
each quilt. The final
decision was to keep the

patterns simple so
that I could actually
make cuddly quilts
in a timely fashion. I
made equal
numbers of both
kinds of nine
patches in green,
blue and red. These



then became the checkerboard quilts. The brightly coloured fabrics were used to make the 5th quilt.





Every bit of bright scrap was sewn together to get enough pieces to make the bright quilt. I even kept

the backings cuddly flannel but plain in pattern to maintain the focus on the featured Nepal fabrics.

When my niece returns from her current MSF (Doctors Without Borders) assignment of helping to prevent covid-19 in the migrant camps in Reynosa Mexico, these guilts will be



gifted back to her so that she can decide where they go. I do love to play with the fabric scraps she brings me from around the world. Ursula

Blendables & Solid Color Cotton Threads, by Joyce Drexler.

An interesting book, that talks about the sulky thread and stabilizers how and when to use these products. Along with ideas and projects, using the

machine embroidery stitches you have on your machine. This book comes with a color chart of the latest sulky threads and a CD with video's and extra projects.

The projects range from bags, paper piecing, and thread sketching to Free motion lacework, Serging fun, making serger lace,



making cards, friendship bracelets, punch needle work and 3D projects. A book well worth perusing and getting inspired by or even try some of the projects. Each project in the book is a product of a national known quilter or designer. Ineke

Quilt Folk Issue 7 Louisiana

Although called 120 Original Embroidery Designs this book contains so much more. Called "Patchwork

Embroidery" by Yoko Saito it combines patchwork and embroidery into one. The book has 120 embroidery designs along with detailed patterns and instructions on how to make the 20 projects featured. She also has very clear diagrams on the embroidery stitches she uses. I have used the book as an inspiration and source material for my on going crazy quilt projects. I used
