
- 2. Do you have a workshop suggestion? Please write your ideas in the workshop booklet at the meeting or email Karri.

Please don't forget to let myself know of any new books you would like to see in the library and I will do my best to purchase them.




Expert quilter, Gina Perkes, shows off the beauty of grid work in her new book. Use the grid intersections as visual guides to improve free-motion skills.






The Art of Classic Quiltmaking is a necessary reference for every quilter's library.
