LIBRARY REPORT

Remember a link to our library can be found by visiting the webpage, clicking on the "Library" in the menu, then scrolling down to the "Instructions on using the online library" and clicking on the "cpqg.libib".com link. This takes you directly to the library.

Books have been placed in groups, i.e. appliqué, scrappy, fiber arts, etc. We now have a new "pro" program so now all you have to do is *click on the picture of the book and a small screen appears with the description of the book.* The library number is found at the beginning of the description, i.e. B 113, write this down and on meeting day look for the book in the library. 




This collection of coordinating projects is exactly what is needed: fun & easy projects with applique. 24 projects all created with time and design in mind. Make any room your own personal style statement.


