
LIBRARY REPORT

Weightless Quilter submitted by Donna H

When we have been quilting on Zoom, a few ladies have been interested in my "DIY Weightless Quilter". You can buy them for a significant price, or make one yourself for \$50 max with PVC pipe!! Just think of the extra fabric you could buy?!!!!

So, I thought I would share a few of the sites that inspired me. I ended up using 1(a) for mine. What would I do differently next time? I would fill the tubes that sit on the floor with dried grains or rice. It would give the system more stability. For now, I have it wedged between tables and it works just fine!


Other than PVC pipe, I have seen them made with a coat rack (3). Also you can use a dog groomer's stand that has a clip. (Myself, I'd want at least 2 clips, 3 for larger quilts.)

If you want to attach/suspend from the ceiling, you can use the system in (4). Instead of the cupboard handles, you could just screw hooks into a ceiling cross beam. Or, the possibilities are endless!

The largest quilt I have done mine is 86" square. The smallest, 45" square, particularly when I am ruler quilting. Feel free to contact me with any questions.
