
If you participated in the Judy's challenge quilt, we would like you to bring your project (finished or not).

LIBRARY REPORT

The Guild has an extensive collection of books and magazines. These books can be signed out by members in good standing at the monthly guild meetings

Our library borrowing policy:

- Books are borrowed for 1 month. All materials are due back at the next Guild meeting. If you are unable to return them, please try to get a friend to bring them back for you. Late fees are \$1.00 per month per book until they are returned to the library. There is a small plastic jar by the book return bin where you can place your late fees.
- Please let us know if any books are damaged or outdated so they can be repaired or discarded.
- Enjoy & be sure to share any of the quilts, or items you have made using our library materials.



Borrowing/Returning a Book:

When borrowing a book from the library, remove the library card from the pocket in the book.

Write your membership number and your name on the card, hand it to the librarian who will date stamp the card and give you a Date Return card to place in the book.

To return the books place them in the bin located on the library table, when there is time the librarian will check these books back into the library.

Please do not remove books from the bin before they have been checked in. If there is a particular book you wish to borrow and it is in the bin please ask the librarian to set it aside once it has been checked in.

Instructions on how to use the online library:


A link to the library can be found on the website and at cpqg.libib.com.

 The books are listed alphabetically under categories, i.e. appliqué, bargello, children, patchwork. Click on the picture and a new window will open with a description of the book. At the beginning of each description there is a "B" followed by a number – this is the number of the book in the actual library.


- 2. If you see something you would like to borrow, write down the name and number and bring to the next meeting and search the shelves for the book.
- 3. To search for a book by a particular author or the year in which it was published has become easier: in the upper right hand corner of the page, there is a small box with "Title" displayed, click on this box, a drop down box appears with "Authors" and "Published" displayed. Click on authors, and the authors will now be listed alphabetically.



BOOK REVIEW



This book was donated to the library quite some time ago. At first I hesitated to add it to the library as it was published in 1987 and the techniques for making lone star quilts have improved since then. However, when reviewing the book I discovered many variations of the lone star block within. So if you are interested in making a lone star quilt I recommend you take a look at this book, and then use today's techniques. Quilting designs have also been included by the author.



Can mitered corners really be easy? The answer is a resounding yes. Create a "frame" using folded fabric strips, any 90-degree ruler, a marking pen, and a sewing machine. Then fold back the straight portion of the mitered frame to give it a charming scalloped effect. Skip the math-simple alignment guarantees accuracy every time. Choose from nine distinctive projects: quilts, table toppers, a tote, pillow, and more. Pair strips of different colors and turn back the bias strip to reveal a contrasting underside.
