This is a new small project challenge that will be introduced at the September meeting. It's a fun, easy Make one / Take One exchange that everyone can participate in.


September: make a mug mat, bring it to the October meeting in a brown paper bag and take a different one home!!!! See Janet S with any questions.

Male deodorants: 13 / See Janet S for more info.




