Let's share our Christmas spirit!! Join the meeting wearing your Holiday Finest or your Ugly Christmas Sweater. Don't forget your mulled wine or




cider, hot chocolate or spiced tea to add to the festive spirit.

Member Presented Programs and Demos

After Hannah and Ineke's, and Karlie's fantastic presentation at the November meeting, we realized that our guild doesn't have guidelines in place on how to reimburse members for their time and effort when they do a program for our guild. We discussed this at the December executive meeting and have decided to implement the following rates: Members who do a full program (45-60 minutes) will receive \$150. Members who do a shorter program/demo will receive \$50.

If any of our members feel that these amounts are not enough or they are professional quilters and usually charge a higher rate for their presentations, they are of course welcome to let the programs committee know what they think is an appropriate amount for their time. We feel that we shouldn't expect our members to offer a program without any kind of recognition or reimbursement.

We realize that our members don't necessarily expect to be paid for their program contributions, and some might be hesitant to accept payment. In this case, please donate the amount to your favourite charity or use the money to purchase supplies for We Care quilts that you donate back to the guild. We don't want anyone to feel an obligation to refuse payment for a program they presented because someone else didn't accept payment either.

I would like to use this opportunity to encourage all of you to contact Sonja and the programs committee if you have an idea for a presentation that would be of interest to our membership. Many of us have been quilting for quite a while and have lots of quilts to show and stories to tell.

This past month saw 25 quilts generously donated to Agassiz, Cheam Village and Community Services as well as locally to Ann Davis Transition House, Hospice and Better Beginnings. **Thank you to all members** for their efforts and commitment!

Despite Covid 19, our guild continued to make guilts as well as masks for those in need. 125 guilts were donated over this past year even though there was No distribution from March through August. Organizations began accepting quilts in September. Recently we have been approached by the need for quilts by Ann Davis Transition House. Mental and physical health has had a significant impact on their services and numbers are constantly rising. After consultation with Shelley Bollen (CEO), they will accept used quilts in good condition, laundered and placed in a sealed bag. No labels have to be attached but if you do donate used guilts, I (Ginger) would appreciate being informed so that the numbers may be included in our yearly totals. Once again, anyone wishing for a precut guilt kit, please email the guild. Labels may be obtained from Lyn R. Please take all used, washed quilts sealed in a plastic bag to Ly and Ginger will drop off at the Ann Davis Transition House.

What's APP in Quilting?


We are all in some level of lockdown these days and likely spending more time online and more time in our sew rooms than ever before.


Here are some very useful APPS that combine technology with our favourite hobby - quilting of course!


