Block of the Month

The block of the month program begins this month and continues to June 2024. For this series, there will be a total of 9 all new blocks, from October to May, with ideas for sashing and borders available in June. Individual finished blocks will measure 12" square.



Each month, you will receive a dedicated email a week ahead of the monthly meeting...it will contain the pattern and instructions for the latest block. Please review the information, and print it out for future reference. The blocks will range from beginner to intermediate to help encourage our new quilting members to participate.

Fabric requirements will be block by block, so dig into your stash, pick a colour scheme, or go completely scrappy...it's up to you.

At each of the monthly meetings, you will be able to view a sample of the monthly block...and Nancy will be available during the break to answer questions.

We are in the process of contacting several other agencies regarding quilt distribution and they will be presented to the membership when contact and their needs are determined.

Thank you to the people who donated the 14 quilts at the September meeting.



Quilt Show 2024

Yes, it is that time again when we start to think about our quilt show in 2024. Our first task is the making of the raffle quilt. Last quilt show we made over \$1500 dollars on the sale of the tickets and we ran out of tickets to sell during the quilt show leaving many visitors disappointed. We will have to print more for the coming show.

It seems early to be starting the raffle quilt process a full year in advance but I know from experience it takes several months to finish all the work and have the tickets ready to

sell for late spring.

At the October meeting there will be a sign-up sheet for anyone interested in cutting the block pieces, sewing the blocks together and completing the ironing.



I have run the last three quilt shows and am willing to continue in this role for two more years, however we need a quilt show mentee who will work along-side me for the 2024 show to learn what is involved and to take over for the 2026 year with me as an advisor only. Please ask me any questions if you think you might be interested. If no one steps forward that will be the end of our quilt shows.
