Barbara Gilbert

Barbara is a textile artist and an embroiderer who uses the traditional stitches of various embroidery techniques in an experimental way. She creates her own background fabrics using dyes and paints, adds textural interest with fabric manipulation and threads and embellishes these surfaces with a modern interpretation of stitches – both by hand and by machine. "I love the excitement of working with colour and creating textured effects with paint, dye and stitches. I like to mix the old traditional techniques with modern fabrics and designs. Designing my own work is a challenge that I enjoy."

Barbara is pushing the boundaries of traditional embroidery into the art world.


