## **JANUARY PROGRAM**

Rules for the quilt top challenge:

- Either bring your own fabric or take a We-Care kit
- If you plan on using your own fabric, cut the blocks 6 x 6 inches. They will finish at 5.5 in. You will need 56 blocks (7 x 8) (no borders required).
- Bring your own thread, sewing machine, ironing board and iron as well as all the notions you might need.

## Rules for the hand work challenge:

- You can trace the hearts or embroidery pattern only onto the fabrics but no cutting allowed until we start (see the patterns at the end of the newsletter)
- We already printed some templates but if you would like to print it, make sure to print without scaling it. If you have questions, please contact Carla

Anyone interested in competing some blocks for We Care, either embroidery or applique, you are welcome to do some at home or during the challenge. You will be able to donate your block(s) to the guild afterwards.

We are looking forward to having a lot of fun. In February, it will be vendors' night. If you have extra fabric, notions and the like that you would like to part with, bring them to the guild meeting and you could make some money.

#### Tuxedo Cats Block of the Month 2019

I have started another Block of the Month this year. It is called "Tuxedo Cats", the quilt will be mostly black and white with just a few dots of colour. There will be twelve blocks again, all appliqué (the fusible kind), all black and white cats. There will be piecing involved this time in creating the sashing, it made the black and white design more interesting than just adding plain strips. It is foundation pieced and mostly made up of Flying Geese units. Each block will be posted on my blog on the first day of the month at 9 am and will be available for free download until the end of the month. The last block in December will include instructions for the sashing and the borders.

#### **Breast Cancer Heart Pillows**

I dropped off another load of heart pillows right before Christmas. Jenny sends her thanks along to all of you who participate in the project. The patients love them, they provide a lot of physical and emotional support. I have enough pillows left for one more delivery but need to collect more before next summer. 


#### LIBRARY REPORT

I have a selection of new books and hope you can find some inspiration in their pages.


