Raffle Ticket Sales



Challenge Quilt 2022

A Botanical Colour Wheel - from Wanda

Theme: Anything botanical; from a tree to a bud, flower, even a vegetable. If it grows, it goes.

Size: Not to exceed a total circumference of 100 inches. It can be irregular in shape.

Method of construction: Create a 3-layer quilted piece using your choice of technique, paper-pieced, applique, traditional themed-block, collage, etc.

Now, for a bit of challenge.

- Use a split-complimentary colour scheme.
 Use a colour wheel to find the different colour combinations. Alternatively, do a 'Google' search for a Split-complimentary Colour Chart. You will find a great amount of helpful information and examples.
- Your piece must show the three different colour groups, in whatever balance works for you. White and black are free colours to use if you wish.
- Include some element of fabric manipulation, eg., pleats, folds, gathering, pin-tucking, etc. The little yo-yos we make are an example of fabric manipulation.
- Add some embellishment; a little or a lot.
- Attach a hanging sleeve.
- Attach your label with your name on it, and then cover it over with pinned or loosely basted fabric.

Split-complimentary colours just naturally work well together. I hope you have fun creating your masterpiece!


