- Best in Show (Members' Choice)


Other category items to be displayed all together at the show (no prizes)

'Conversations' is FAN's newest travelling exhibition; I had the pleasure of putting together all aspects of this exhibit. Conversations premiered as a concurrent exhibit during Quilt Canada's National Juried Show this past May 31 to June 2, in Vancouver, British Columbia. It is an exhibition of work comprised from 48 different FAN members.

FAN (Fibre Art Network) is a cooperative of Professional Fibre Artists in Western Canada, showcasing original fibre arts. The group is committed to promoting fibre art as an art form and each other as artists. FAN members come from British Columbia, Alberta, Saskatchewan, and Manitoba, the Yukon, Northwest Territories and Nunavut. FAN membership includes emerging fibre artists, teachers, authors, judges and award winning textile artists; their bios can be viewed here. FAN Artists Many have shown their work nationally and internationally and some have won both national and international recognition for their work. The cooperative engenders fellowship



of like-

minded friends and celebrates differences as well as common interests. We share our learning and news in a monthly newsletter, through our website fibreartnetwork.com and at an annual conference where we connect and stretch our comfort zone. We currently produce at least one show per year, with several available for exhibition.





For **Conversations** the members partnered and created a conversation that set the boundaries for their imagery so that the two pieces responded or related to each other. The partner groups were varied from siblings or best friends to acquaintances or complete strangers who forged new friendships. They used a wide range of traditional and contemporary fibre-art techniques in a variety of styles from realistic to abstract. Decided upon were the general theme, colours, size and orientation of the pieces through actual face-to-face meetings, email or texting. Some of the artists shared fabric across the two pieces and connected the

imagery from one to the other while others responded to a similar concept. Many of the works included text or parts of their conversation on the surface of the art. All of the partners were required to submit a narrative of their conversation, which provided interesting reading and insights into their work. A complete viewing of all the artists' work can be seen here. FAN Conversations Hopefully you will be able to view this spectacular work in person,

Conversations will travel for a period of two years to various galleries across Canada.
