# Look what's happening at the February Meeting!

Our speaker for February will be Cherri Mathieson who is an historian (B.A., M.A. in progress).

The topic will be about the Underground Railroad (1810-1850) which is how many American slaves escaped from the US to come to Canada.

It was the use of quilts and the hidden messages embedded in them that played a pivotal role in guiding slaves safely out of the American South.

The courage of people such as Harriet Tubman and others who risked their own lives to assist approximately 100,000 slaves out of the south underscores the truly unique history / herstory and contribution of quilt makers to the early beginnings of emancipation for African American slaves.

Thank you so much to Darlene T and Cherri M who have filled the lead positions of Advertising and Raffle Ticket Sales.





### Make a block support a family fighting cancer

A good friend of Rachel B's, her son, Ethan, has been diagnosed with cancer again for the second time. At age 7 he was diagnosed



with Osteosarcoma (Terry Fox cancer) and battled for almost 2 years, including multiple chemo treatments, an amputation of his leg with a rotationplasty, and a severe infection post-procedure. After nearly 5 yrs of being cancer free he was recently diagnosed with Myelodysplastic syndrome (MDS), and has now advanced into leukemia . In Ethan's case, his MDS is the result of the chemotherapy he received in his previous battle with a different type of cancer. Which is a 1 in a million chance of getting another type of cancer! What makes this situation even worse, is the chemotherapy typically used for fighting MDS has already been used for treating his
