




We Care

Two-Minute-Statement

The BC Legislature offers its members the opportunity to make two-minute oral statements on a topic of their choice on each sitting day. Laurie Throness, our MLA for Chilliwack-Kent, wanted to honour the work of our two guilds and gave the following statement on August 11:



Two minute statement - Quilters of Chilliwack

Today I want to pay tribute to some really outstanding artists in Chilliwack; our quilters. We have two nonprofit quilting guilds in our City that meet every month. The PieceMakers Guild meets in the Presbyterian Church, and Chilliwack Quilters' Guild gathers in the Mount Cheam Lions Hall. Together, over 160 active members have been creating masterpieces for as long as 35 years.

At their meetings, quilters have a lot of fun sharing ideas, learning new skills and showing off their handiwork, and every year they host a big art show that fills an entire gymnasium with 200 beautiful quilts.

The purpose of the show is not just to showcase talent, but to raise money for a charity they call 'We Care Quilts.' Members make nearly 300 colourful quilts every year to give away. Their quilts comfort and encourage people in hospice and palliative care, children who come into contact with community police, women in Ann Davis Transition House, and several indigenous centers. They make placemats for Meals on Wheels, heart pillows, and cloth bags filled with toiletries, gloves, socks and hats for disadvantaged youth.

And they have been active during COVID. Agnes Loewen, a member of Piecemakers Guild, told me that over the past few months she alone has made 6 We Care quilts and over 100 masks.

I was amazed at the sheer size of their organizations. Their large boards organize everything from the We Care effort to their newsletter, website, library, workshops, bus trips, quilt show and more. It would be hard to find a more active and involved group of volunteers, passionate about their work.

I want to thank PieceMakers President Beatrice Rieske and Chilliwack President Lynn Garbay, all their board members, and members at large of both quilter's guilds, for using their time and skills to give beauty, life, charity and comfort to the people of Chilliwack.
