Quilt Challenge


To Celebrate the year 2020 the theme for our Quilt Show Challenge is "Twenty Twenty"

Quilts will be displayed at our quilt show.

Rules of the Challenge

- #1 Rule: Have Fun!!! Use your imagination!
- You must include at least one of each of the 10 items on the list (see the guild web site for a complete list) plus 10 items of your choice for a total of 20 items. Quilt must measure 20" x 20" finished.

Registration for the 2020 show will open after the March meeting. The registration form will be available as a digital file (pdf) only. Registrations will only be accepted via email.

If you need help, I will be available to answer your questions and help you learn how to do it. This will save us a lot of time in the long run as it eliminates the need to transcribe all the forms.



The form will be sent out as an email attachment from the address quiltshow@pumpkinpatchbc.com on March 19, to all guild members. This email might end up in your spam folder. Please keep an eye on your spam folder or add the address to your address book, then it won't be classified as spam.

To make sure that nobody misses the email, we will send out an email from the regular guild address afterwards to let everyone know the registration form has been sent and to remind you to check your spam folders if you haven't received it.

You can click on any of the blue/grey fields in the form and type in the required information. Please leave the item # blank (field in the top right corner), this will be assigned later. Save

the form and email it back to me. A separate form is required for every item you would like to enter.

This year I will also be accepting digital entries in other formats if they have the required information. This means that if you have trouble with the pdf, you can use a text document or put the information in an email. If you do this, please ensure that you have included all necessary information and made clear which of your measurements is the width and which is the length of your quilt.

Scans of the printed form will **NOT** be accepted. All information has to be typed (no handwritten entry forms, please), and I need to be able to copy and paste the information.

You will receive a confirmation email that I received your registration, and I will list the items you registered. I will reply to every single email but please be patient and give me at least 48 hours before writing again.

If you don't hear back from me within a reasonable time frame, I haven't received your email. Please contact me again, and we will figure it out. Call my business number at 604-701-3203 and leave a message or email me, and I will get back to you.

Registration will close on September 30, 2020 or possibly earlier if the number of required quilts is reached before this date. The day guild ended up with way too many.
