


## Guild Buddy / New Member Orientation

I have not had time to remove all the titles from Libib online so hopefully none of you are looking for books we have removed.




If you have any requests for new books please let myself or one of the others in the library know and we will do our best to purchase it.

The 1718 silk patchwork coverlet. (American Museum in Britain)

The American Museum in Bath is the only museum of American decorative and folk art outside the United States. I visited it over 30 years ago, long before I thought about becoming a quilter. The museum always has at least 50 quilts ranging from the eighteenth to mid-twentieth centuries on view

A recent exhibition showcased a 300-year-old silk coverlet that was made in 1718, however, the oldest piece of fabric dates back to 1640! The coverlet measures 66 ½ inches by 73 inches, and is made up of 182 blocks.

There are over 120 kinds of fabric in the coverlet. It would have originally been much brighter but only natural dyes were available and these have faded over time.

The woman who stitched the patchwork is unknown, but she was from the village of Aldbourne in Wiltshire. The letters "e H," are stitched on the back, and on one of the coverlet's blocks. Whether "E H" is one person or two, is unknown.

## 100 Quilts Still Needed

The registration deadline for our 2018 quilt show is September 30 which is only three, weeks away as I am writing this. **We still need approximately 100 more quilts!** Registration has been extremely slow, and while I understand that everybody is busy during the summer, it is now or never! Without your help we can't make this show happen. If you have been procrastinating, I don't blame you as I like to refer to myself as the Queen of Procrastination. But we are running out of time, so please sit down and take ten minutes to send in your registration.

If procrastination is not your problem but you are intimidated by the technology involved in registering your quilts via email, then please, please, please ask me for help. I am going to be honest here, I am very disappointed that only \*one\* guild member asked me for help so far. Remember, there are no stupid questions. Nobody expects you to be perfect. If you are not comfortable asking me for help, ask your kids or grandkids. They can probably do this in their sleep. I consider myself rather comfortable with technology but my son rolls his eyes at my technical abilities all the time. It makes a huge difference if you grew up with computers and email, and most of us didn't. Don't feel bad if you don't know how to do this but please ask for help.

Wendy and Karlie have graciously offered to accept paper registrations at the September guild meeting and transcribe them. Organizing a quilt show is a huge amount of work, and if one hundred quilt registrations are handed in on paper, this will create hours of additional work for them. Please take a moment to consider how you can help speed up the process.

If you are not comfortable with pdf-files, you can also just type the necessary information in an email and send it to me. From the email I can just copy and paste into the registration form which is much faster than having to transcribe everything manually. If you have a portable device, you are welcome to bring it to the guild meeting, and we will help you with the email registration.

There is a solution for any problem you might have with the registration process but I can't help you find it unless you tell me. Please take a moment to contact me, and we will figure it out together.

# Consignment Boutique - Reduce Your Stash, Increase your cash



Join us at the Quilt Show Boutique and bring along:

- Quilts, Wall Hangings, Place Mats, Bags, Bowls, Boxes, Mug Rugs, Pin Cushions, Zippered Pouches and anything else that you can make out of fabric.
- Fabric, (please put small and medium pieces in plastic bags), yardage can be rolled, securely taped or tied and tagged as per instructions.
- Buttons, and Beads, Ribbons and Threads (also to be bagged and priced)
- Quilting Tools

**Donated** Books and Magazines do not need to be priced. They will be placed in bins with books to be sold for \$2.00 and magazines for 50 cents. **Donated items** must be marked with a suggested price using masking tape. **Do not add your name**.

The guild will collect a 20% commission on all consignment sales.

All items for sale are to be brought to the church Friday morning and dropped off in the boutique area outside the gymnasium Wendy and I will not collect items prior to that time. Please bring your items in a tote or box for ease of handling.

Sandra will have some price tags available at the September guild meeting. There will also be examples on how to mark your items for sale. Please roll larger pieces of fabric and tie each one securely.

## September To-Do List Pre-Show

- 1. Return your sold raffle tickets stubs/money to Grace L, collect more to sell if you wish.
- 2. Please be prepared to sign up on the Volunteer Chart for a job that will help make the show days run smoothly. We made a good start at the June meeting; however there are many spots left and ALL MUST be filled in by October.
- 3. We will be in need of many large tables (6 or 8 feet). We are also seeking quilt racks is you can loan one. When they are delivered please be sure you name is on all loaned items. They need to be delivered to the church Friday morning and picked up Sat late afternoon. There will be a sign-up sheet at the October meeting if you can help with these items.
- 4. Label all items with your name going in the show with either a quilt label or making tape.
- 5. Attach a 4" sleeve to the top back of your quilt, either sewn on or safety pinned (no straight pins).
- 6. Collect advertising posters to distribute.
- 7. Bring items for the raffle basket.
- 8. Collect items for the boutique/sale table, to be delivered Friday morning of the show.
