

# Carla's Visit to Cozy Cottons Quilting

I went to the new quilt store Cozy Cottons Quilting last week. I met the lovely owner, Angela Hrusik and chatted a bit with her. Here are a few facts she shared with me:

- Angela started quilted after the birth of her twins. They were born at 25 weeks and weighed 1 pound

- 6 ounces. So they had to stay at the Special Needs Nursery in an incubator. The NICU had different quilts for each baby in the incubators. This how she knew which babies were hers by looking a the quilts that each had received because they kept the same quilt. She actually had these quilts in the store and she showed them to me.
- About 2 years after having her babies, Angela took a quilting course at Hamels and she has been quilting ever since.
- Her kids have never slept in a bed without a quilt to this day. In Angela's mind, a quilt is like a warm hug or a hug from a friend, it makes her heart happy.
- Because of her personal experience, our We Care program is really close to her heart and for that reason, Angela will support our program as much as she can.
- Angela has never belonged to a guild, however she will try to attend our next Zoom meeting.

I really enjoyed my chat with Angela. She is very enthusiastic and very helpful. So let's hope that Angela will be able to join our guild and I am sure that many of our members will be happy to support her.
